## 1. Buderim and Surrounding Areas

### *Buderim — the Community*

In 2012 Buderim celebrated 150 years of white settlement. From a small village hub serving the local farming community, Buderim has developed into a thriving residential community, spreading across the plateau and down the escarpment to embrace new communities surrounding the mountain. Just after the Second World War, Buderim was home to some 600 people: currently over 50,000 people call Buderim home. Buderim has been identified as one of Queensland's top "tree change" destinations.

Buderim residents love their town. The main through streets of Burnett, Main, and King which run into each other are the life line that holds this overgrown village together. A large Shopping Centre, boutique Shops, restaurants and cafes and Buderim's public buildings and parks front these streets. They say it's the people and the particular sense of community that makes it special and, regardless of population growth, they want "their Buderim" to be preserved. This strong sense of community has been nurtured for over 70 years by the Buderim War Memorial Community Association (BWMCA) which provides a wide range of activities and services to the community. Saint Mark's Parish is one of its seventy members. (See Appendix 1). It is to this vibrant people focussed community that we are called to be the people of God, to minister, and to proclaim the good news of the Kingdom.

### *Boundaries*

Appendix 2 shows Buderim in relation to other areas of the Sunshine Coast.

### *Areas of Influence*

Fifteen minutes drive down the mountain to the East, via Buderim/Mooloolaba Road, is the Pacific Ocean with its rolling surf and pristine beaches, and the popular beach resort communities of Mooloolaba, Alexandra Headland, and Maroochydore. To the South are the communities of Mountain Creek, Chancellor Park, and Sippy Downs: while to the west, there are the communities of Glenfields, Tanawha, and Forest Glen. All look to Buderim as the centre of their cultural and social activities.

### *Schools*

The local Chamber of Commerce sees education as one of its fastest growing industries. On the State scene, Mountain Creek High School is one of the largest in Queensland with students attending in two sessions daily to maximise use of available facilities. Chancellor State College is one of the Government's Colleges of Excellence. There are four large private schools, with Matthew Flinders Anglican College (MFAC) acknowledged as one of the ten best academic achieving schools in Queensland, and certainly one of the leading academic schools in the Anglican School system in the Province of Queensland. Strong ties have existed between MFAC and Saint Mark's Parish.

### *University and TAFE*

The University of the Sunshine Coast (USC), this popular and growing institution, located in Sippy Downs, to the south of the Parish, and now in its twenty-third year of operation caters for over 20,000 students, and covers a wide range of academic pursuits. It hopes to add a medical school now that the Sunshine Coast University Public Hospital is built. The Ramsay Private Hospital adjoins the Public Hospital.

The Sunshine Coast Institute of TAFE has a large campus (the Mooloolaba campus) at Mountain Creek.

The University of the Third Age (U3A) operates out of the USC campus, and provides a wide range of subjects which are held at its rooms at the USC and many other locations across the Sunshine Coast, a number of courses are run out of Saint Mark's Parish hall throughout the year.

### *Hospitals*

The Buderim Private Hospital, owned and operated by Uniting Care Health. The hospital is within the Parish boundaries, and is regularly ministered to by the Parish's hospital visitation teams, and the clergy as required.

The Sunshine Coast University Public Hospital (SCUH) and the Ramsay Operated Private Hospital (SCUPH) are in close proximity at Birtinya and are both hospitals of excellence. Specialist doctors in most medical disciplines are available in Buderim, Birtinya and in the Nambour Public hospital and Selangor Private Hospital.

## 2. The Ecclesiastical Parish of Buderim

### *Parish Boundaries*

The present boundaries of the Parish of Buderim were agreed on 22nd August 1999. In hindsight these can be seen as seeking to curb Buderim's area of influence to the plateau and its escarpment, and speaks more of the then unreal territorial ambitions of the Parish of Maroochydore. There is now an urgent need to redress these boundaries to include in the Parish of Buderim these new areas of population (parts of Mountain Creek, Sippy Downs, Glenfields,) which have an affinity with, and look to Buderim and its activities and organisations as their natural focus and are not ministered to by anyone.

Appendix 3 shows the presently agreed boundaries of the Parish.

### *Areas of Influence*

Just as the surrounding communities look to Buderim for their social and cultural pursuits, the Parish also draws its eclectic congregation from these areas, and further afield.

### *Short History of the Parish*

Saint Mark's Buderim, with a number of other worshipping centres, was initially part of the large Parish of Palmwoods with the then Church, now the Parish Hall, being erected in 1917. In 1981 Saint Mark's was created a separate Parochial District with the Reverend William Jolly as Priest in Charge (1981-1984). It was during the incumbency of the Reverend Neville Jackson (1984-1994) that the Parochial District was granted separate Parish status and the present Parish Church built. The Venerable Richard Gowty was the second Rector. (1995-2012). The Venerable Jeremy Greaves (now Bishop for the Northern Region) the third Rector (2013-2017). The present priest in charge, Reverend Mother Moira Evers (2018-2022).

The Parish stands firmly in the Liberal Catholic tradition of the worldwide Anglican Communion in its worship and liturgy. The Holy Eucharist is currently celebrated each Sunday at 7am and 9am and on Wednesdays at 10am and on other Saints days and festivals from time to time.

### *Parish Buildings and Assets*

#### *Church*

The Foundation Stone of the present Parish Church was laid on 18<sup>th</sup> June 1988 by the Most Reverend Sir John Grindrod, Archbishop of Brisbane and Primate, and was dedicated on 25<sup>th</sup> November 1988 by the Right Reverend George Browning, Bishop for the Northern Region. The Church was finally consecrated on 25<sup>th</sup> April 1999 by the Most Reverend Peter Hollingworth, Archbishop of Brisbane. Subsequently, a Chapel dedicated to Saint Mary the Virgin was added to the South of the Sanctuary, and was consecrated on 26<sup>th</sup> September 2005 by the Most Reverend Dr. Phillip Aspinall, Archbishop of Brisbane and Primate.

The Church, which is air-conditioned, seats 250 in traditional pews, with a further 26 single chairs in the Chapel. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved in an aumbry in the wall of the Chapel which is used for week-day celebrations, Healing Service, etc. The Church building houses the Parish Office, the Priest's Office, the Priest's Vestry, and a Committee Meeting space which doubles as a creche.

Outstanding features of the Church include its stained glass windows, the oldest of which are the Good Shepherd Window, set in the eastern wall of the Sanctuary, and originally above the altar in the original Church building (now the hall); the Rondels, in the side windows from the original Church, all designed and executed around 1918 by the esteemed Brisbane artist, William Bustard; the large modern Saint Mark's Window by Glen Mack installed in 1996; the over 175 tapestry cushions and kneelers worked by members of the Parish Tapestry Guild.

The Geo. Fincham & Sons Pipe Organ built in 1986 for a Melbourne church and installed in Saint Mark's in 1998, the memorial gift of a parishioner.



### *Parish Hall*

The Parish Hall was built in 1917 as the Parish Church and was used as such until the dedication of the present Church. It was extended in 1967. A further extension with the kitchen, toilets, and open annexe was blessed on the 22nd August 1999 by the Right Reverend Richard Appleby, Bishop for the Northern Region. The interior of the hall was further upgraded and air-conditioned in 2010. It is much in demand during the week and is used by Parish organisations and by a wide range of community activity including U3A Groups, Karate, Kung Fu, Yoga, Bytes Youth Theatre, Physie and Dance, Buderim Male Choir.



### *Angligrreen*

With the assistance of a grant from the Queensland Government Gambling Community Benefit Fund, a photo voltaic solar power generating system was installed with solar panels on the eastern roof of the church building. This reduces our carbon footprint and brings some relief to ever rising power bills. A water tank is installed which supplies water used in the toilets, and for the watering system for the gardens.


### *Memorial Garden*

A quiet reflective place is provided in the gardens of the church for interment of ashes and a place provided for memorial plaques.



### *Wunya Park*

This area of natural vegetation lies to the north of the parish church and has been developed as an area for quiet contemplation and relaxation. A path from the northern carpark leads to a reflection platform with indigenous paintings and icons.



### *Western Portico*

This area has been developed as a place of quiet contemplation and reflection.



### *Rectory*

The current Rectory, set on a quarter of an acre of land, is situated at 24 Wilguy Crescent, Buderim, some 2kms from the Parish church and hall. It is highly unlikely that the present Rectory will be available to a new Rector. The mind of the newly elected Parish Council is to realise the capital value of this property and to address the matter of a new Rectory once an appointment is made. These decisions, while not set in concrete will need to be worked on in conjunction with the Diocesan authorities. It maybe that the new Rector may wish to purchase his/her own property and a suitable housing allowance would be negotiated to assist in this regard.

The Rectory will be rented commercially until such times as a new Rector is appointed and a final decision on its future made.

### *Vehicle*

A suitable new vehicle will be provided for the new Rector. Alternatively, a car allowance would be paid should the Rector choose to provide his/her own vehicle.

## 3. Regular Parish Services

### *Sundays*

0700 Holy Eucharist, AAPB Second Order, said. This service attracts a mixture of age groups, and averages some 40 plus regular communicants. These numbers increase during the summer months. Refreshments are served after this service.

0900 Family Eucharist, AAPB Second Order. Uses a modern musical setting, with a mixture of traditional and modern hymns accompanied alternatively by a large pipe organ and a modern electronic keyboard. A mixture of all age groupings attends this service with an average communicant number of 70 plus. The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is usually administered during this service, which greatly swells the worshippers on these Sundays. Refreshments are served after this service.

Up until recently a third service, a Choral Eucharist, was offered at 10.30am. This service was heavily weighted to the older parishioner.

### *Weekdays*

Wednesdays, 1000 Holy Eucharist, AAPB Second Order, said with an average communicants of 5.

Morning Prayer is said daily and is offered online.

The Church is open daily for private prayer.

### *Additional Services*

Evensong – Fourth Sunday of the month at 1700 (from February to November). Evensong is a short service about 40 minutes of readings, prayers and hymns.

Taize – Second Sunday of the month at 1800 (from February to November). Taizé style services at St Marks are quiet times of Christian prayer, song, readings and reflection and last about 45 minutes. The service begins in stillness and silence with songs and proceeds without announcements.



Pancake Church – Twice per school term at 16.00. This innovative service is designed to attract parents and children.

### *Other Festivals, Saints Days, and Special Services*

#### *Ash Wednesday*

Holy Eucharist and Imposition of Ashes in Church at various times and the Imposition of Ashes in an announced public place in the village.

#### *Holy Week and Easter*

Palm Sunday — Normal Sunday programme of two Services with the Blessing and Distribution of Palms. In a non-covid environment palms have been blessed and distributed ecumenically at a service in the Buderim Village Park prior to each denomination processing to their parish church.

Maundy Thursday — Commemoration of the Institution of the Lord's Supper and the Washing of Feet.

Good Friday — The Good Friday Liturgy

Easter Eve — Vigil Eucharist, Baptism, Confirmation, Renewal of Baptismal Vows, and Reception into the Anglican Church

Easter Day — Normal Sunday programme of two services

### *Patronal Festival and Dedication Festival*

As the Feast of the Patron and Anniversary of the Consecration fall on the same day which is 25th April which is also Anzac Day, these commemorations are translated and celebrated on the second Sunday in October.

Musical concerts by both local and international artists are held regularly in Saint Mark's Church.

The Church is used by Community Groups such as the Sovereign Order of Saint John of Jerusalem.

The church is the Conventual Church of the Sunshine Coast Priory of the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem Knights Hospitaller, an ancient Order of Chivalry. A number of parishioners are members and the Prior is one of the Parish Nominators. The Regional Bishop, the Right Reverend Jeremy Greaves is the Priory Chaplain.

## 4. Parish Ministers

### *Stipendiary*

#### *Rector*

The present Priest in Charge, the Reverend Mother Moira Evers leaves the parish on the 6th of March 2022 and the Parish will be ministered to by a Locum Priest to be appointed.

#### *Parish Secretary*

This is a part time position (3 hours per day, 0900 to 1200, Monday to Friday) filled by Mrs Debbie Bradshaw. Main duties consist of co-ordinating the Rector's diary, producing the weekly Pew Sheet, managing the Parish computer, and producing all communications. She attends to the rental of the Parish hall to diverse organisations, prepares and keeps the records for Baptisms, Admission to Communion, Confirmations, Weddings, and Funerals, as well as arranging the many rosters so necessary to the smooth running of the Parish.

#### *Musicians*

The 0900 Sunday Family Eucharist has the services of a paid keyboard player. The funds for this are provided from a scholarship available to a student from Matthew Flinders Anglican College. The organists give of their services voluntarily.

#### *Sacristan / Verger*

This role includes preparing the vessels for each Eucharist, washing the altar linen, changing the altar frontals, etc., and oversees the general cleanliness of the Church and hall.

#### *Liturgical Assistants*

There are currently 18 licensed Liturgical Assistants licensed to the Parish and are rostered for the 0700 and 0900 services. A number of these are involved with Home Communion, Retirement Villages, and Nursing Homes of the Parish (See also Parish Ministries).

#### *Church Office Bearers*

#### *Churchwardens*

There are three churchwardens. Two elected by the people at the Annual General Meeting and one appointed by the Rector.

### *Nominators*

Three are elected annually at the Annual General Meeting and should there be a vacancy in their term continue in office until an appointment is made.

### *Members of Synod*

Two members are elected every three years.

### *Parish Council*

Two Members nominated by the Rector

Four Members elected by the Annual General Meeting

Parish Treasurer

Together with the three Churchwardens, two Synod Representatives and three Nominators

### *Sidespersons, Readers, and Intercessors*

Each Sunday, different members of the two congregations are rostered for duty in these important areas of ministry. Individual parishioners take their place on the monthly roster.

## 5. Parish Ministries

### *Mainly Music*

This very popular playgroup is currently in recess.

### *Bible Studies and Study Groups*

The Monday Study Group meets in the Church foyer at 1300 to 1400 hours.

The Tuesday morning Bible Study Group commenced in October 1984 and some original members still make up this group and meet in members homes.

The Tuesday evening Bible Study Group meet at 1900 either in a member's home and/or online.

### *Occasional Study Groups*

Lent and Advent — Small study groups using set material are held throughout the Parish during these seasons, and parishioners are encouraged to join these as part of their preparation for Easter and for Christmas.

### *Mothers Union*

St Mark's branch of the Mothers Union meet monthly in the hall. They are an integral part of the Diocesan Mothers Union scene. One of their greatly appreciated activities is to ensure that every child baptised is given a handmade Teddy. Money raised from their activities assist in Diocesan outreach work.

### *Friends of Saint Mark's*

This informal group meets as required to organise social and fund-raising events in support of the Parish. There are a variety of events which happen throughout the year. Recently an Artisans market was introduced and is held monthly in the hall and parish grounds.

### *University of the Sunshine Coast (USC) Food Bank and The Shack Nambour*

Each Sunday during semester time, members of the two congregations bring non-perishable packaged or canned food which is taken to the USC Food Bank to help feed students struggling to juggle costs on little or no income. This initiative is greatly appreciated by the university authorities. "The Shack" at Nambour is also supported in this way.

### *Pastoral Care*

At Saint Mark's, Pastoral Care is an important component of parish ministry. Each week a dedicated group of parishioners give of their time and talents in:

Home Communion by Liturgical Assistants, Visitations to Anglicans at the Sunshine Coast Private Hospital, and visits to the sick and shut-ins.

The Holy Eucharist is celebrated monthly in the following Retirement Villages.

### *Saint Mark's Flower Guild*

This talented group of ladies enhance the beauty of the Church with three large arrangements of flowers each week. The abundant gardens of Buderim provide the greenery and flowers in season to complement the wonderful collection of silk flowers held by the parish.

### *St Mark's Makers Group*

St Mark's Makers meets monthly on the first Thursday from 10:00 am 'til noon in the church hall. Members happily share their skills in Embroidery, Cross Stitch, Calligraphy, Knitting, Crochet, Sewing, Card making, Scrapbooking, making bees wax wraps, Smocking etc.

### *Parish Website*

In keeping with modern technology, Saint Mark's Church has a presence on the Worldwide Web. This site is currently under reconstruction.
